### F. New Business

- The Mayor presented a request for Rolling Pig Pin for May 5, 19, and 26 from 11am – 2 pm for use of the Farmer's Parking Lot for food truck sales. <u>On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr.</u> <u>Potts, the request was approved.</u>
- II. The Mayor presented a request by Chick Fil A for the Farmer's Parking Lot for May 1, 2, 5, 8, 9, 12, 15, 16, 19, 22, and 26th from 11am to 1pm, and May 1, 8, 15, and 22<sup>nd</sup> from 4pm to 7pm. <u>On a motion by the Mayor, seconded by</u> <u>Mr. Earley, the request was approved with the request</u> <u>being forwarded to the Retail Committee of the Common</u> <u>Council to review use frequency of the Lot.</u>
- III. The Mayor presented a request for The Magic of Books/Pacey Apothecary for an outdoor Fall Festival, 2 – 8pm, on September 23<sup>rd</sup>. They are requesting West 2<sup>nd</sup> St from Chestnut to the train tracks be closed. This is a Spring and Fall event. Vendor booths and food trucks
