- F. New Business
 - i. Mayor Nicholson presented a request from the Seymour Museum Center for their Annual Gala – August 29th. They are requesting the closure of 3rd St from Chestnut to the Alley from August 28th to August 31st. On a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, all the request was approved.
 - ii. Whitney Koelling from ARA presented some invoices from the Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation program to be paid from the grant received by the City. The invoices today depleted the grant. 28 different households were helped with needed repairs from the grant. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the invoices were approved.

 - 1. Jullian Drive and Glenbrook should be wrapping up and getting paved next week.

2. 2026 CCMG has started with work on the west side of Snyder Acres. CCMG 2026 will pause for a time this summer and will then get back on track late summer.
3. Burkart repaving was needed due to high traffic, alligator cracking, and excessive costs later if not properly maintained.
